

Opening Discussion:

Are you or have you ever been a ‘royal watcher’ (someone who follows the British royal family)? What do you know about royalty in our world? Which countries function as monarchys? Take some time to talk about royalty as a precursor to talking about King Jesus.

Opening Prayer:

Begin your time in praise—spend some time marveling at the majesty of our King.

Getting into God’s Word

Did you have any comments or questions from this Sunday’s message? Take the time to look through your sermon notes and talk about any questions you had.

Our Hope

Read 1 Corinthians 15:1-11, and 35-58

1. What stands out to you in these passages?
2. Paul begins this passage by talking about the message we believe (v3-9). His summary is surprisingly simple—talk about this simple gospel.

How did you first hear the good news about Jesus? How have you shared the good news about Jesus?

3. Paul also references the resurrection of Jesus as something that was witnessed by many people—some of whom could still serve as references. Why do you think that is significant? Have you ever been called to be an eye witness? How many eye witnesses are typically needed for something to be confirmed as true?
4. Have you ever spent much time thinking about the resurrection? Does the imagery Paul uses of a seed bring clarity?
5. Jesus has done an incredible work of victory on our behalf—sin and death have been defeated—Is this your hope? How does this hope impact your life on a day to day basis? How might this hope have impacted Paul’s life on a day to day basis?
6. Paul ends with a command that we be strong and immovable because nothing we do for the Lord is ever done in vain—are there places in your life where you are feeling like your work for the Lord has amounted to nothing? How does this passage give you hope?

Read Matthew 28:18-20 and 2 Corinthians 5:11-21

7. What stands out to you in these two passages?
8. These passages both speak of commissioning and responsibility we have as Christ’s followers to represent Him and tell others about Him—do you feel like you are on mission for the King? Do you wake up thinking about Him and His call? Why or why not?
9. How can the church equip you in greater ways to live on mission for Him?
10. Who are you praying for, that they would come to know Christ?

Prayer

Close your time by praying for one another—

Pray for those that your group identified that you are praying would come to know Christ—especially in this season, where there is an openness to the person of Jesus—pray that God would draw them to Himself.

Pray as well for courage and opportunity for one another to represent the King.

Finally pray for any needs and burdens your group has.
